

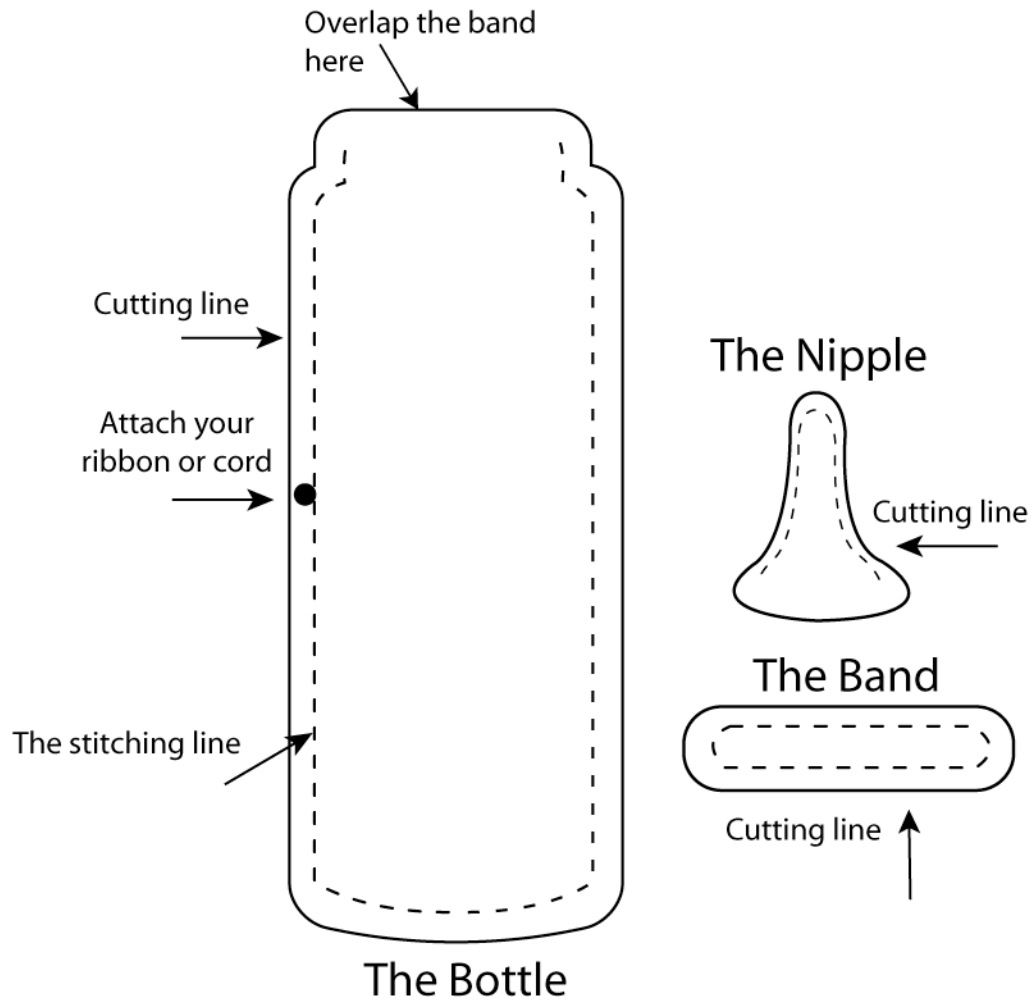


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Ornament Series 2  
Who's Bottle Is This?  
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### Pattern Pieces and Diagrams



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Who's Bottle Is This?  
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**Fabrics:** fleece, flannel, heavy cotton, and felt. We like fleece the best, but for a kids group project, felt would be perfect.

**Filler:** batting or heavy flannel.

**Thread:** button twist, quilting, embroidery, candlelight, embroidery floss, regular sewing thread.

**Hanger:** 10" or ribbon, cording, yarn etc.

**Optional:** Tear-away stabilizer, tissue paper, typing paper

The look you want will determine your fabric, filler and thread choices. There really are no rules 😊.

### Instructions

1. Determine your fabric and batting.
2. Transfer the pattern shapes to your fabric and cut out. Cut out 2 of all pattern shapes.
3. Transfer the pattern shapes to your filler and cut out.
4. Trim these filler pieces 1/8" to 1/4" smaller than your original size. This will allow you to stitch them down without the filler showing beyond the fabric.
5. If you want to embroider your child's (or grandchild, niece, nephew etc) name onto the baby bottle, you need to do it now, before assembling the ornament..
6. Add your filler piece to the back of the bottle.
7. Take your 10" hanger medium, fold in half and pin into place as show on the pattern diagram. About 1" of the hanger needs to be inside or to the filler side of the bottle.
8. Sew the bottle together (front – filler – back) as shown on the black & white illustration. We used a long straight stitch with a button twist thread. Remove any pins when finished.
9. Put the bottle nipple together (front – filler- back) and stitch as shown above; place the nipple in between the front/filler and back of the bottle band; pin.
10. Place your nipple and band group over the bottle itself. Be certain to place the band on each side of the bottle. Use your straight stitch and stitch completely around the band as seen on the diagrams.
11. Remove any pins, make sure your hanger is secure – and hang your "Who's Bottle Is This" ornament.

If you're going to use "Who's Bottle Is This" as a project for kids, you can do away with any batting or filler. Use felt for the bottle and embroidery floss for the kids to sew by hand.
